

Food Scraps to Local Farms

GUIDELINES:

<p>5 gallon buckets with good lids :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Label your buckets and lids to be sure they are returned. • Swap empties for the full ones. You need twice the number you fill between pick-ups. • Discuss who will rinse &/or clean buckets. (i.e. farmer might rinse but you might scrub) <p>Note: Most Hobart industrial dishwashers can fit 5 gal buckets.</p>
<p>Pick-up/drop off schedule:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Discuss with your farmer. • Notify them of upcoming changes.
<p>Know what materials your farmer accepts/rejects:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Food scraps must be free of contaminants. No plastic, glass, metal, or dog/cat feces, etc. • Remove produce stickers. • Pigs cannot have meat/fish or any food that has come into contact with it. See: www.anr.state.vt.us/dec/wastediv/solid/documents/SwineFeedingPolicy.pdf • Ask if they accept coffee & filters, and uncoated, ink-free paper products (paper plates, napkins, paper towels-with no cleaning chemicals).
<p>Toss food scraps into a “kitchen” bucket that you daily clean and empty into the outdoor 5 gallon bucket(s). This will keep smells and flies outside and your kitchen healthy.</p>
